

but it is not intended to be a comprehensive pleading. It does not, nor is intended to, traverse every single point of evidence in the Crown's case. It is simply to set out, in accordance with the statutory guidance, the broad nature of the defendant's case.

3. No admissions are made by the Defence as to the prosecution's case. The prosecution brings the case and they must prove it and are put to strict proof of each ingredient of the single count on the indictment.
4. **The defendant (SP) denies the allegations as alleged or at all.**
5. **By way of overview, SP denies murdering or unlawfully killing any of the 4 deceased. Further, SP denies raping or assaulting by penetration any complainant. All sexual activity alleged in the indictment took place with consent. Further, SP denies intentionally administering or causing any substance to be taken by any person without their consent. Such drugs that were taken by various complainants were taken voluntarily by them and were never 'administered' by SP.**
