Hi Andy,

A MOPAC Town Hall Meetings/Roadshow will be held in Barking and Dagenham on Monday 10 November September 2014.

I need to draft a briefing for the Deputy Mayor policing and Crime and would be grateful if you could provide relevant background information around the following areas, (I know a number of issues will overlap) and anything else the DMPC should be aware of:

Town centre/night time economy. Barking is the main town centre area, although Dagenham also has a concentration of shops in the Heathway. The main type of shops are chain stores, betting shops and cheap discount stores. There is no significant night time economy, although with a growing ethnic population this is gradually changing

Anti Social Behaviour/ Serious Youth Violence Vulnerability Assessment Desk has robust mechanism for repeat callers into GPC which provides escalation to a VOLT meter which is shared daily with partners from the local authority ASB team. This provides immediate multi-agency intervention for high risk cases and manages expectations and provides reassurance around police response to ASB. Rolling FYTD show reduction in Repeat Callers by 15% and reduction in total ASB by 20%.

There has been an increase in VWI relating to young people in Barking town centre so we have reviewed our resourcing in this area;

- Street Duties team moved from Dagenham Police Station to Fresh Wharf patrol base in Barking
- Increase high visibility patrols, supported via met Tasking bids (Mounted branch recently supported patrol plan
- Implementation of a 'Business Against Crime' scheme in Barking Town Centre - Based around the successful 'Business Watch' projects. Meetings in place with key stakeholders in the coming months.
 - MSC reviewed with local SPOCs assigned to manage, develop and ensure best use of assets in key areas. (Town Centres, transpot hubs, Hotspots linked to ward priorities).

Drug related issues The main drug issues on the Borough relate to Cannabis rather than any other drugs. The council have funded a 20 PC strong Estates Team and 4 PCs for a Safer Parks Team to help combat this issue. Between July and September the Safer Parks Team made 18 arrests for a variety of offences, issued 25 Penalty notices and 86 cannabis warnings.

Confidence issues This is one of our 3 challenges - we are currently at 53% in Quarter 1 14/15 borough results. We hold regular confidence meetings and follow a comprehensive confidence plan. Some of our strategies to increase confidence are;

- Continuation of social media strategy, such as Twitter, local press, Time FM radio interviews with key staff, Phase 3 advertising campaign on billboards and bus stops around the borough
- Review and increase the number of contact points on the borough
- Continue bi-weekly newsletters
- Review and increase KIN membership for Virtual Ward panels
- initiate monthly visits to faith premises

Relations with partners We have an excellent relationship with the local authority with several teams co-located in council buildings and two teams of police offices. The Borough were the first in the MPS to set up a Safer Neighbourhood Board;

they also have a Stop & Search scrutiny sub-group. The IAG has recently been reinvigorated; it has a proactive Chair who ensure it is fully representative of the community and a member of the IAG attend all Gold Group meetings.
