A number</p> <p>8 of interested persons are present on the live link. As</p> <p>9 this hearing is being conducted as a partially remote</p> <p>10 hearing, it is necessary for me to formally state at the</p> <p>11 outset that I give permission for the use of live video</p> <p>12 to enable participants to access these court</p> <p>13 proceedings. I should emphasise that it is a contempt</p> <p>14 court to record, play, dispose of or publish a recording</p> <p>15 or transcript of these proceedings, this means it is</p> <p>16 a criminal offence to make or attempt to make any record</p> <p>17 or broadcast of these proceedings.</p> <p>18 MR O'CONNOR: I am grateful, madam.</p> <p>19 I believe that the link is now established with the</p> <p>20 upstairs room, so the members of the jury panel are able</p> <p>21 to see and hear what is going on this in this room, and</p> <p>22 I invite you then to invite Mr Hughes to select the</p> <p>23 jury.</p> <p>24 THE CORONER: Yes, shall I just address the panel first?</p> <p>25 I cannot actually see them but I assume they can see me.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 1</p>	<p>1 One of our spares was the lady who had indicated</p> <p>2 a difficulty with the English language, so I will just</p> <p>3 clarify with her -- which number was she? She was</p> <p>4 number 3, but which number was she?</p> <p>5 THE INQUEST MANAGER: Number 12.</p> <p>6 THE CORONER: In the event that juror 16 went, she would be</p> <p>7 on the panel.</p> <p>8 Thank you very much.</p> <p>9 THE INQUEST MANAGER: Could I just remind, if you are ready</p> <p>10 for the jurors to come down, if they could, and I think</p> <p>11 they upstairs have been following the numerical order,</p> <p>12 bring them down in the order in which they were called.</p> <p>13 THE CORONER: Certainly.</p> <p>14 THE INQUEST MANAGER: Thank you, madam.</p> <p>15 THE CORONER: Could those 18 whose names were called please</p> <p>16 head down, I hope you have a member of staff who will</p> <p>17 show you where to go and come in numerical order, and,</p> <p>18 when you get here, if juror 16 could make himself known</p> <p>19 to me, I would be very grateful.</p> <p>20 THE INQUEST MANAGER: Madam, there is no need to preserve</p> <p>21 these numbers any more?</p> <p>22 THE CORONER: I don't think so. Thank you. (Pause)</p> <p>23 The first six can all take their seats, thank you.</p> <p>24 Have we reached as far as juror number 16.</p> <p>25 Sir, before you take your seat, so we can preserve</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 3</p>
<p>1 Good morning, everyone, I know you are in a room</p> <p>2 upstairs. Thank you all for coming to Barking today,</p> <p>3 especially bearing in mind the horrendous weather that</p> <p>4 we all experienced this morning, and for answering your</p> <p>5 jury summonses. My name is Sarah Munro, my normal day</p> <p>6 job is as a senior circuit judge at the Old Bailey, but</p> <p>7 for these purposes I am sitting as a coroner in charge</p> <p>8 of the inquest that we are going to start here today.</p> <p>9 In a moment, you will hear Mr Hughes and his</p> <p>10 colleague call out 18 of your names. Will you listen</p> <p>11 carefully, note when your name is called but don't move</p> <p>12 anywhere until we have reached number 18. We are going</p> <p>13 to select 18 of you and you will then be told when to</p> <p>14 come down to join us down here in the courtroom.</p> <p>15 Thank you very much.</p> <p>16 (12.31 pm)</p> <p>17 (The jury were selected)</p> <p>18 (12.34 pm)</p> <p>19 THE CORONER: Thank you.</p> <p>20 Of those selected, number 16, is the gentleman who</p> <p>21 has the holiday difficulties, so when he comes down</p> <p>22 I will ask him a few further questions. Is that right?</p> <p>21 No, 25.</p> <p>22 You can take a seat, sir, thank you.</p> <p>23 I will hear from you in just a moment, madam, thank</p> <p>24 you.</p> <p>25 That means we now have 16, doesn't it? You</p> <p>10 have all completed questionnaires and I think I had</p> <p>11 dealt with all those who had raised queries. Did you write that on a form?</p> <p>13 A JUROR: I did.</p> <p>14 THE CORONER: Yes, but you say you could not stay beyond</p> <p>15 4.30?</p> <p>16 A JUROR: On a Thursday I need to leave early because I need</p> <p>17 to pick up my child straight from school, I don't have</p> <p>18 any other childcare arrangement.</p> <p>19 THE CORONER: You would have to leave by what time on</p> <p>20 a Thursday?</p> <p>21 A JUROR: 2.00.</p> <p>22 THE CORONER: 2.00?</p> <p>23 A JUROR: Yes, because I have to travel to get to her school</p> <p>24 from here, she finishes at 3.00. Other days I have</p> <p>25 childcare arrangements, apart from that day I can't</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 7</p>

<p>1 THE CORONER: We could probably deal with your employer 2 situation, but if your worried about your command of 3 English, can you remind me of what number you are, sir? 4 A JUROR: Number 19. 5 THE CORONER: All right, I will excuse you. You can go. 6 A JUROR: Thank you. 7 THE CORONER: Any more problems? No. 8 Excellent. Thank you very much. I just think we 9 might have to take stock a little at that point. 10 MR O'CONNOR: Yes, my -- I think accurate -- calculation is 11 we should have four people left upstairs, and I wonder 12 madam in the circumstances whether we shouldn't invite 13 them to come down. 14 THE CORONER: Could we invite the four that remain upstairs 15 to come down, please. 16 I can't see round you, Mr O'Connor, is there just 17 one juror here now? 18 MR O'CONNOR: Yes. 19 THE INQUEST MANAGER: Madam, it appears that two of the 20 jurors have left the building and been sent home, 21 inexplicably. So we have two. 22 THE CORONER: All right. Thank you. 23 That is a total of 14 now. 24 MR O'CONNOR: Madam, I think where we are is we have 11 25 jurors and 3 reserves.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 9</p>	<p>1 these inquests. Experience has shown us that sometimes 2 after a juror has been sworn in, an unexpected issue 3 arises which means they cannot in fact serve on the 4 jury. That is where the rest of you come in, who sit to 5 my right. We therefore keep some spares, if you don't 6 mind me calling you that, so that we can call upon you 7 and coopt you onto the jury if that sort of circumstance 8 arises. 9 As you know, everybody has completed questionnaires 10 and we have raised questions this morning, so I am 11 hoping it will not arise. I am therefore going to ask 12 all 14 of you to come back on Tuesday morning. 13 If there is no further difficulty, I will then 14 release one of the three spares, the other two will 15 stay, numbers 12 and 13, until Tuesday afternoon, and if 16 there is no further difficulty then, I will then release 17 those two jurors as well. 18 The purpose of that is, we hope, that if there is 19 a difficulty with any of the existing 11, we can replace 20 them with one of you and avoid having to start all over 21 again. 22 I am now going to ask Mr Hughes to swear in the 23 jurors to my left. 24 (12.53 pm) 25 (The jury were sworn)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 11</p>
<p>1 THE CORONER: Three reserves, right. 2 Is everybody content for me to proceed on that 3 basis? 4 MR O'CONNOR: Yes. 5 THE CORONER: Thank you very much. 6 Introductory remarks by THE CORONER 7 THE CORONER: Good afternoon again, everybody, and my thanks 8 again to you all for coming to Barking Town Hall this 9 morning. 10 Let me explain to you all why you are here. 11 On Tuesday of next week we will commence hearing 12 inquests into the deaths of four young men who were 13 murdered by a man called Stephen Port in 2014 and 2015. 14 They were killed by him with overdoses of a date 15 rape drug, as it is sometimes called, GHB, and their 16 bodies were discarded by him yards from where we are all 17 sitting now, and that is why we are here in Barking. 18 The inquests will be high profile, and I believe 19 interesting for all of us who will be involved. They 20 will no doubt be covered in some detail by the press. 21 I shall come back to that after I have dealt with some 22 practicalities. 23 We have selected 14 of you, 11 of you will form the 24 jury. The 11 sitting to my left, and shortly the 11 of 25 you will take oaths in order to enroll as jurors in</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 10</p>	<p>1 (1.03 pm) 2 THE CORONER: Yes, thank you very much. 3 All right, ladies and gentlemen, you will have seen 4 so far while you have been in this building the efforts 5 that have been made to maintain the social distancing 6 and to continue to observe Covid precautions. All 7 I ask, please, is that when you are walking around the 8 building would you please put on a mask, unless you are 9 exempt for any reason, but of course it is entirely up 10 to you whether you continue to wear a mask when you are 11 in court and sitting down. 12 Equally, when you are in your retiring room or your 13 assembly room, please endeavour to maintain social 14 distancing so we don't have any difficulties as far as 15 Covid is concerned. 16 The next things I need to deal with are really, 17 really important, and they are two vital rules, which 18 you, all 14, please, must comply with from this very 19 moment until I tell you that they are relaxed. 20 The first is in relation to talking about the case, 21 talking about these inquests. You don't know very much 22 about them yet but I have told you the headline and of 23 course you have seen in the questionnaire some of the 24 names concerned and the list of witnesses. But from 25 this moment, as I say, it is absolutely vital that you</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 12</p>

<p>1 do not discuss any of those names, anybody involved in 2 the case or anything about the case with anyone, even 3 amongst yourselves, until I say otherwise. 4 That is because we are only going to end up with 11 5 of you on the jury and it is really important there is 6 no discussion until we are down to 11, which will be, as 7 I say, I anticipate on Tuesday afternoon, so until then, 8 talk about anything else while you are together but not 9 about the case itself, please. 10 The reason for that is very simple, as I say we will 11 go down to 11 in due course, you will then become the 12 jury and you will then be allowed to discuss the case 13 amongst the 11 of you, but not until that has happened, 14 all right. That is rule number 1. 15 Rule number 2 is that you mustn't discuss the case 16 at any time with anyone who is not on the jury. So for 17 now no discussion at all, from when you are down to 11, 18 I will repeat this in due course, no discussion with 19 anyone who is not on the jury because it is only the 20 jurors who have taken the oaths who have the solemn duty 21 to return the conclusions at the end of the evidence. 22 The next matter, equally an important rule, is that 23 you must not attempt in any way to try to obtain any 24 additional information about these inquests or about 25 anybody involved in them. As I have already indicated,</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Page 13</p>	<p>1 I will open these inquests to you and you will hear much 2 more of what they are all about. If you are not used to 3 coming to this part of London, please leave ample time 4 so that you are here in good time, because we cannot 5 start without you and we have a pretty strict timetable 6 that we have to keep to. Please do your best to keep 7 those times. If you are delayed unavoidably, we know 8 that happens from time to time, you will be given 9 a telephone number that you can ring, and so please do 10 ring and let us know why you are delayed and how long 11 you are likely to be, but can I ask in the first 12 instance that you leave masses of time so you are not 13 delayed and bring something with you to read if you are 14 kept waiting at any stage. 15 You are going to go now with Mr Hughes and his team 16 and he will give you some practical advice about where 17 we go from here and what arrangements have been made 18 upstairs for you.
