Again, like a world of his own, just like a child would play with a toy. It was very, very bizarre to see.

NARRATOR: Ryan detected a darker side to his neighbour when he dropped into Port's flat one afternoon for coffee a little unexpectedly.

RYAN EDWARDS: Stephen took ages to get to the door and he sort of shuffled up and opened the door and he looked absolutely dreadful, like he hadn't slept a wink. His eyes were red raw and he was very -- almost slurring his speech.

As I sat down, I was completely shocked because on the coffee table was a massive clear plastic container that actually filled the whole circumference of the coffee table. And it was full of vials of clear liquid and sachets of white powder. I was completely taken aback. There were dozens and dozens of clear bags of white powder and, again, dozens of these vials of clear liquid.

It really disturbed me because it was a huge -- it was obviously a huge amount of drugs, far, far beyond personal use for someone. So, you know, what on earth was he doing with them?

NARRATOR: When Ryan met some of Port's boyfriends, they revealed a violent and abusive character.

RYAN EDWARDS: On this one occasion I asked, "Why? What had happened?" And he said, "Stephen had pushed me into a TV and I'd cut my head". There was another time where one of the boyfriends said that Stephen had actually been violent to him.
