

JANE DAY: I swear by Almighty God that the evidence I shall give shall be the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth.

CORONER: Thank you. And could you confirm the background facts?

JANE DAY: On 28 August 2014, police were contacted by a member of the public, alerting them to the discovery of this young man deceased within the grounds of St Mary's Church, Barking, Essex. Emergency Services attended. Life was pronounced extinct, and police report that the circumstances are non-suspicious.

A post-mortem examination was conducted at Queen's Hospital on 1 September 2014, and Doctor Soosay gave the cause of death as mixed drug overdose. Gabriel was formally identified by his mother and brother at Queen's Hospital, Romford, and a statement of identification provided.

CORONER: Thank you very much. Could you confirm the first piece of evidence?

JANE DAY: The first piece of evidence, ma'am, is a document of the (Inaudible) identification from Adam and Maria Kovari.

CORONER: Thank you. I have a statement from Adam and Maria Kovari, dated 4 September 2014, and they confirm that at Queen's Hospital mortuary they formally identified the deceased as their brother and son, and his name was Gabriel Kovari. His occupation was student. Place of birth was Kosice. And the date of birth was 17 June 1992. His marital status was single. And I am going to mark that statement as C1 for the court record.
